You can call me "Deep Sea".

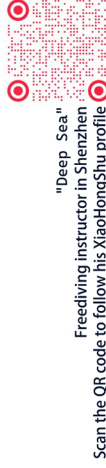
My story with the sea has been sailing for 10 years
